On the death of our former headmaster Dr. Ralf Weghöft

Unfortunately, we have to share sad news with you: 5th of February, our former headmaster Dr. Ralf Weghöft passed away at the age of 68 after a short stay in hospital. Two times, he visited Neerpair and the Dr. Arulappa Higher Secondary school. The whole school community of Albert-Schweitzerschool and the Arivu-team was deeply touched by this unexpected message. Many have written in a book of condolences and have also taken part in the funeral ceremony.





Chain for peace against war in Ukraine

Many people in Germany and Europe are very concerned about the war in Ukraine, which has been going on for over a year now. To express their concern and the wish for peace worldwide, an alliance of peace initiatives from Münster and Osnabrück have called for a human chain to be formed between these two cities on 24 February 2023, the anniversary of the attack on Ukraine.





Despite the rainy weather, about 20,000 people gathered on the 45 kilometers separating the two cities to make a statement against the war that has now been going on for a year.

The march started shortly before 16:00. Everyone held hands, from Osnabrück to Münster. In most places the chain was closed. However, where there were not enough people, it was closed with ropes. Many people also brought their own posters. From our school, 200 students got involved to take part in the chain for peace. When the chain was closed, the church bells rang. Afterwards, the song "Give peace a chance" by John Lennon was played and many people joined in. In retrospect, we can only hope that this sends a signal against war.

India Club and other activities at Gymnasium Oesede

Every year in February/March, our school invites the pupils of the surrounding primary schools to an open day. The aim is for the future fifth graders to get to know their new school. Our school, Gymnasium Oesede, wants to present itself in the best light and has prepared many interesting information stands, but also



activities to take part in. A special highlight are always the experiments in chemistry and other natural sciences, but also the foreign languages English, French, Spanish and Latin.

This year we also informed about our partnership with the Dr Arulappa Hr Sec School in Neerpair for the first time. The India-AG created interesting posters and together with some teachers colourfully decorated the room. Lassi and Indian snacks were served and found enthusiastic consumers.



Before the Easter holidays, the India-AG took it upon themselves to inform our youngest pupils, namely standard 5, about our partnership project in India. They created a PowerPoint presentation and used photos to report about the Dr Arulappa Hr Sec School, the primary school and St John's home. The pupils of year 5 listened with interest. They were particularly moved by the simple conditions in which many children live and the injustice they have to experience as Dalits. At the same time, they were impressed by the commitment of their peers, how important the school is for them and the joy with which they go to school. Now we are very happy to welcome Nandhini, Viji and Ambrose to our school in April and hope to hear a lot more from them.









On Monday, 23 January 2023, the India-AG informed the entire 5th grade about the living conditions in India and about the partner school in Neerpair. The pupils listened attentively and got an impression of how different a childhood is in India: If you come from a poor family, you often cannot go to school, but have to help out at an early age so that the family does not go hungry. A good school education is important to build a life for oneself!

It quickly became clear to the 5th graders that they wanted to learn more about their peers and want to continue supporting this project.

Primary school in Buschhoven



In February, Aktion Indien got a donation from the primary school in Buschhoven near Bonn. For more than 18 years this school is supporting the projects of Aktion Indien.

We are very thankful for their commitment and constant support!

On the homepage of their school they write:

Fr John Suresh and Ms Nandhini Krishnan already visited Buschhoven twice and told children and parents about the life of his pupils. This gave our children a direct connection to the aid project. Every year during Advent, we organise a project week, our "Musical Week", in which the children work on a theme in different ways. The results of the work (handicrafts, presentations, small demonstrations, etc.) are sold at the end of the week at our "Colourful Afternoon" or offered for donations. The entire proceeds go to the "Project India".
